Dozens of employees from many different agencies stepped in to give a hand processing Unemployment Claims that were coming in at a rate we've never seen before.

And, working together across multiple agencies... the State used \$5-million-dollars to create an "Economic Stimulus Equity program" Making sure those who weren't included in the individual federal stimulus program ... but should have been... received a check.

And of course... so many more... which we'll hear about throughout this event ... including outbreak prevention... addressing food insecurity and homelessness... connecting Vermonters with broadband so they could participate in school, work and healthcare... and the I.T. needed for the administration of new grants, built from scratch to get billions in federal aid out the door.

And... let's not forget... you've been doing all this work while keeping the wheels of state government moving.

On top of all the new COVID-related work... you each have your own day jobs... serving and protecting Vermonters... managing programs... fixing roads... expanding broadband... building housing... and so much more.

And collectively... we've continued to work to grow the economy... make Vermont more affordable... and protect the vulnerable by building safe and healthy communities.

Your hard work and dedication are like none I've ever seen.

We're very fortunate to have you as public servants.... responding to the needs of 625,000 people.

Together with fellow Vermonters... we've been united in our commitment... sense of duty... care and respect for one another.
